

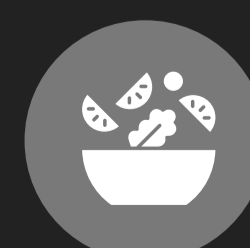


# Food System Resilience Program

(23 May 2022 to 15 Jun 2028)

## Objective

The Program Development Objective (PDO) is to improve resilience of food systems and increase preparedness against food insecurity in selected project areas.



## Project Briefer

The proposed Project supports the GoE's vision for structural transformation of the national economy. The Project is also aligned with the Agricultural Sector Perspective Plan (2020-2030) and the Revised Agricultural and Rural Development Policy of the GoE. The National Adaptation Plan and Climate Resilient Green Economy strategy strongly emphasize that climate-smart agriculture is an essential strategy for meeting climate change mitigation and adaptation goals, which this Project is fully aligned with.

This Project also contributes to Vision 2030: Transforming Ethiopian Food System. This Project will contribute to the goals of the World Bank's Africa Climate Business Plan, Ethiopia's Nationally Determined Contribution, and Ethiopia's Climate Resilient Green Economy strategy. The financing aligns with Ethiopia's commitment to the Comprehensive Africa Agriculture Development Project, and with the commitment of The Africa Food Security Leadership Dialogue under Climate Change in Africa to invest in science and promote climate smart agriculture research.

It is in this context that Food System Resilience Program (FSRP) is being proposed as the next flagship project by the MoA to contribute to food-system-transformation, enhanced competitiveness, rural job creation, and improved resilience. This project focuses on three main pillars i) rural job creation; ii) improving competitiveness of agri-food system; and iii) enhanced resilience of agricultural sector.

## SUMMARY

Different policies, programs and strategies have been developed and implemented to increase agricultural growth of the country. As part of this effort the Government has launched a home-grown economic reform agenda", with the objective of transforming Ethiopia from low-income to lower-middle- income country by 2025.

Following this ministry of agriculture has revised the "agriculture and rural development policy" and also designed 10 Years Perspective Plan (2020-2030) to transform agricultural activities by improving productivity, value addition and make small holder farmers competent.

To make this effort practical the Food System Resilience Program /FSRP/ is being developed as the next flagship program following learnings of second Agricultural Growth Program.; with the objective of improving resilience of food systems and increase preparedness against food insecurity in selected project areas.

Food System Resilience Program /FSRP/ has four components: Transforming Agricultural Service and Innovation System, Resilience Small Scale Irrigation Development and Management, Food Market Development, and Improving Enabling Environment for Food System and Program Management. It is implemented in 10 regions and two City Administrations and within this regions and city administration 181 woredas will benefit from the program.
