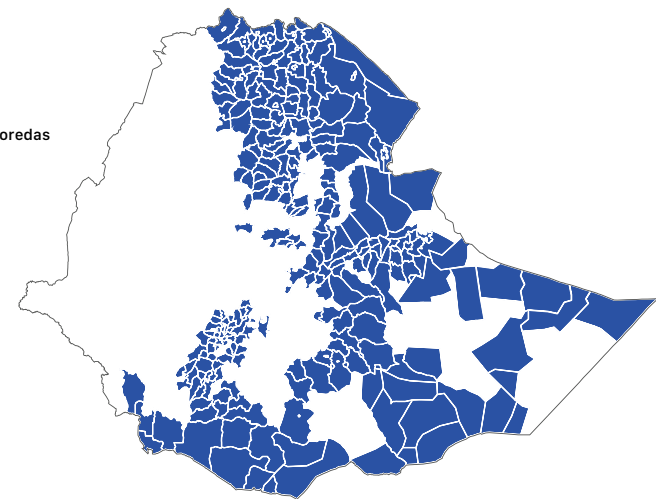




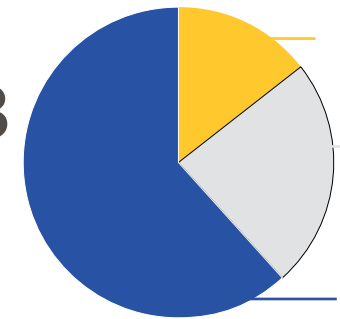







Introduction to PSNP

In response to the need to protect and foster the livelihoods of the vulnerable, the Ethiopian government adapted its emergency food aid system in 2005 and launched the Productive Safety Net Program (PSNP). Besides being a more productive approach to providing a safety net to vulnerable populations, PSNP is one of the largest national social safety net programmes in Africa

PSNP targets extremely poor and vulnerable households in over 408 food insecure rural woredas— an annual average caseload of 8 million ‘clients’— with the overall goal of reducing extreme poverty in PSNP woredas. PSNP interventions are collectively designed to achieve enhanced resilience to shocks of extreme poor and vulnerable rural households. To this end, the program primarily provides cash or food payments against public works that build local infrastructure or promote environmental protection. Fifteen percent of the beneficiaries are poor and vulnerable households with limited labour capacity that receive unconditional direct payments. PSNP also provides complementary livelihood services to enable PSNP clients to enhance and diversify their incomes.

What's New in PSNP 5

-  Better focus on extreme poverty and vulnerability
-  Improved provisions on gender and social risks management
-  Better linkages between public works and livelihoods
-  Modernize key system infrastructures that will aid smooth program implementations
-  Consolidated shock responsive safety net under the management of a single institution in PSNP woredas and beyond
-  Provide higher quality and intensive livelihood support to fewer and better-targeted clients
-  Enhanced focus on facilitating linkages to available social services for PSNP clients

Outputs of the Fifth Phase of PSNP

- 1 Timely and adequate transfers received by eligible core caseload of PSNP clients.
- 2 Shock-responsive transfers received by eligible clients when needed.
- 3 Public Works respond to community livelihood needs and contribute to disaster risk reduction, climate change adaptation and mitigation.
- 4 Linkages to available social services facilitated for core PSNP clients with emphasis on PDS and TDS.
- 5 Tailored livelihood options accessed by eligible PSNP clients.
- 6 PSNP management and capacity enhanced.

Some of the Expected Results of PSNP Phase 5

- At least **80%** of payments made to core clients according to the programme's performance standards for timeliness
- 550K** households supported with credit and/or grants to implement livelihoods business plans on farm and off farm
- 2M** hectares of land treated through area enclosures, rangeland management, soil and water conservation, forage and forestry activities
- More than **1.5M** PSNP clients are expected to graduate by the end of this phase
